Fluid Rhythms: Urban Networks and Living Patterns

Daily life in the city both repeats itself and is constantly changing. The movement of bodies in space; financial transactions; the circulation of sounds, cells, and smells; shifting social constructs that divide and connect people; the flow of microscopic substances — such looping patterns generate dynamic complex structures that shift over time. The course of changing patterns is called rhythm. Where there is rhythm, there is life (C. Nevejan). Working with such dynamic complexities requires paying careful attention to how the social, imagined, and physical realms interact. By investigating the intertwined patterns of change, a world of subtle complexity starts to reveal itself to us in how machines, animals, microbes an humans interact and coexist. Working with rhythms is a way of synchronizing our efforts in acting and living together in a network society.
